## Mission 1

Reactivate engagement with Honiara City through a one-day workshop - 30 stakeholders participated including city councilors and staff, national government and agency representatives and NGOs.

Conduct meetings with targeted groups to complete a first cut of the Detailed Scorecard.

2. Commence work on HCC Disaster Management Plan
3. Advocate on behalf of Honiara City for partners and funding to implement other DRR actions.
4. Integration of DRR and CCA Plans
